SNAP FOOD STAMPS



TO APPLY, CALL 215-430-0556

"SNAP" stands for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. "SNAP benefits" are the same as food stamps. Benefits are provided each month through a plastic ACCESS Card, which can be used at local grocery stores and farmers markets.

AM I ELIGIBLE?

Does your monthly household income fall below these limits before taxes? If so, you may be eligible.

Households with **members age 60+**, or who are receiving SSI or SSD benefits can have higher incomes and still get benefits.

Documented immigrants often qualify for SNAP if they have lived in the country for 5+ years with a green card, or are children under age 18.

College students may qualify for SNAP benefits if the student is enrolled in Federal Work-Study, works 20+ hours per week, has a dependent under the age of 13, or is over age 50.

FOOD FOR KIDS



SCHOOL MEALS: Since schools are closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the City of Philadelphia has announced locations where you can get school meals. Visit phillyfoodfinder.org to find a site.

SUMMER MEALS: In June, July, and August, free breakfast, lunch, and snacks are served to ALL children ages 18 & under and DISABLED students age 21 & under at various faith-based organizations and community centers. No requirements. Call 1-855-252-6325, text "FOOD" or "COMIDA" to 877877, or visit www.hungercoalition.org/summermeals/map to find a site.

WOMEN, INFANTS & CHILDREN (WIC): WIC provides food to the following groups of people: pregnant women, breastfeeding mothers of a baby up to 12 months old, mothers of a baby up to 6 months old, or children under 5 years old. To be eligible, you must be a PA resident and seen by a health professional at a WIC clinic. You may receive WIC benefits even if you work, receive other benefits, or are undocumented.

SHARE Food Program's host sites offer monthly food packages for \$10 to \$30. For each package of food purchased, SHARE asks for 2 volunteer hours, at SHARE or sites in your own neighborhood. You can also buy food with SNAP benefits. SHARE's food packages offer meats, fresh fruits and vegetables, and grocery items.

FROM THE FARM



WIC FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM (FMNP)

This program allows WIC participants can purchase fresh, locally grown fruits and vegetables at farmers' markets. WIC participants receive FMNP checks during their quarterly WIC visit from May to September. Call 1-800-942-9467 for more information.

SENIOR FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM (SFMNP)

Seniors age 60+ living in Philly who meet income requirements can receive \$20 worth of produce by picking up SFMNP vouchers distributed at senior centers in July. Call the Philadelphia Corporation for Aging helpline at 215-765-9040 for more information. The SHARE program also accepts these vouchers for their Farm Fresh Packages.

PHILLY FOOD BUCKS PROGRAM

This program from the Philadelphia Department of Health and the Food Trust encourages SNAP recipients to use their benefits to purchase fresh foods at participating farmers' markets. For every \$5 spent using your ACCESS card, you receive a \$2 Philly Food Bucks Coupon for fresh fruits and vegetables that you can use at participating farmers' markets. DOUBLE DOLLARS PROGRAM AT FAIR FOOD

Fair Food at the Reading Terminal Market offers a cash-match program for SNAP participants. For every \$5 you spend at the Farmstand with your ACCESS card, Fair Food will give you an additional \$5 to spend on more fresh, local food. You can earn up to \$40 per month.
